

DRESS CODE

Members and visitors are expected to show respect for the Club environment, and for each other, by maintaining an acceptable standard of clean and tidy dress at all times both in the Clubhouse and on the golf course.

Extremes of casual dress are not acceptable. As, however, dress sense is a highly subjective topic, the Club would appreciate your support in maintaining the following standards:

Trousers, shorts and skirts: Tailored shorts and trousers may be worn; denim jeans, tracksuits, football shorts and military/patch-pocket styles or similar non-golf attire are not appropriate. Men are required to wear either long socks or predominantly white above ankle socks with shorts. Ladies' shorts and skirts should be of a respectable length.

Shirts: For men, sleeveless or collarless shirts are not acceptable except for specifically designed round-necked golf shirts, and all shirts must be tucked in. On the course, ladies may wear shirts with either a collar or sleeves or both, however collarless shirts should be recognised golf attire and all tops should be tucked in unless tailored and of an appropriate length (a bare midriff is not appropriate).

Shoes: on the course, shoes must be spiked or soft-spiked and designed for golf (trainers are acceptable for junior members under 14 years). In the clubhouse shoes must be worn at all times (trainers are not acceptable) and gentlemen must wear socks with footwear.

Caps: Caps are to be worn peak to the front and should not be worn in the clubhouse.

Mobile Phones: As a courtesy to others, please switch mobile phones OFF when on the course or in the clubhouse.

Spike Bar: For dress code this area can be considered an extension of the golf course.

Lounge Area: Smart casual dress or clean, dry golfing attire may be worn. Golf shoes, trainers, waterproof clothing and caps are not permitted.

Dining Room: Smart casual dress is appropriate and jackets or blazers are preferred at Sunday lunch times. Shorts are not permitted unless by prior agreement for an all-day golf event.

Members attention is drawn to the fact that dress for social, match and other events will be specified on event notices, and that for prize-giving presentations competitors are normally expected to change out of golf clothes.

Ladies are requested to observe the spirit of the dress code where, because of differences in male and female attire, it is inappropriate for them to observe the letter of it.

It is expected that the implementation of this code will be effected with courtesy and common sense, especially as regards guests and visitors. Those who knowingly disregard the dress code may be asked by a member of staff or committee to leave or refrain from entering certain areas of the clubhouse.
